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Checking Valve Stem To Guide

If you want to check the valve guide clearance on a cylinder head during a teardown—or if you want to check after your machinist after he's returned a freshly redone head—insert the clean stem most of the way into the head but leave enough room that you can still hold the valve.

To inspect valve guides for wear, check valve stem-to-guide clearance, and determine any necessary actions using a micrometer, follow the steps in skill Drill 12-4: 1. Clean the guide with solvent and a valve guide brush if not already cleaned. 2.

Measure the inside circumference of the valve guide, and the outer circumference of the valve with a gauge set. Compare the data with the optimum measurements listed in the owner's manual to test whether the valve guides are worn.

How to Know When the Valve Guides Are Worn Out | It Still Runs

Listen to your car running. If you can hear a tapping or rattling noise coming from within the engine, there is a good chance the noise is coming from the valves. Valve noise stems from problems within the engine and with the valves themselves.

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Checking Valve Stem To Guide Clearance

Guide clearance can be checked after cleaning the valve stem and guide with solvent and a brush to remove all gum and varnish. Insert the valve into its guide, then hold it at its normal opening height while checking side play with a dial indicator.

The method I use is to check the ID with a small dia. inside micrometer, mic the outside of the valve stem, subtract the two and you've got your clearance. After doing this for over 20 years you get a feel for it, and seldom need to do the micrometer thing.

Quick Tip #11 Worn Out Valve Guides - YouTube

Maximum wear will occur on the stem closest to the valve head. The second wear point is about ½ inch below the keeper grooves. This is where the end of the guide rests against the valve when it is closed. Check with your fingernail to see if there is a ridge of wear here. If so, toss valve. Valve guides will wear in a bell type of configuration.

The cost of replacing your valve guide seals will vary according to the make and model of your vehicle. The good news is the cost of the parts for valve guide seals is between \$30 to \$100 on average. The bad news is that you are looking at about 2 to 4 hours of labor if you take your vehicle to a mechanic.

5 Symptoms of a Bad Valve Guide Seals and Replacement Cost

Stem Guides are generally recommended at 6" to 8" intervals. Bronze bushings can be drilled up to a 2-1/8" bore diameter for 2" O.D. stems. By removing the bushing larger stems can be accommodated, up to 2-3/8" O.D. Click [HERE](#) for Stem Guides for larger diameter stems.

Valve stem seals allow a controlled amount of oil to lubricate the valve stem as it moves the valve guide. The amount of oil that passes by the valve stem seal must be precisely controlled. Too little oil causes stem and guide wear; too much oil causes carbon buildup leading to valve seat damage, decrease in volumetric efficiency, increased emissions, catalytic converter degradation and excessive oil consumption.

You may have a hole in the tire, but before you take it in to the garage, first check for a leaky valve stem (Step 1). Valve leakage causing compression loss is another reason for engine issues. For this reason, valve guides must be checked, and replaced or repaired if beyond manufacturer's specifications. One thing you can almost always count on when rebuilding a cylinder head is valve guide wear. The valve guides experience a lot of wear; because of the constant friction between the guide and valve stem.

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
